Mr Whalebone is currently in IPD at HMP Elmley. He has had a recent hospital admission for a possible UTI which impacted on his behaviours and cognition. Staff reported that he is visibly appearing much better. Mr Whalebone has long COVID which has impacted on his memory and cognition. Mr Whalebone recognises that his memory is affected which can cause him frustration. Mr Whalebone can also become fixated on certain things; at the time of the assessment he was fixated on having Frosties as on IPD they are not available, only cornflakes. Sugar is not permitted in the prison, only sweetener.

Mr Whalebone has no recalling of falling x4 times whilst in hospital; he reported he had bruising on the back of his thigh but no recall of how he sustained this.

Mr Whalebone is a former accountant who previously resided in Sidcup (111 Maidstone Road) where he lived with his wife. Mr Whalebone enjoys regular phone calls with his wife and daughter. He currently doesn't have a phone in his cell and relies on staff to dial the number required and pass the phone to him as he has difficulty pressing the numbers on the phone. Mr Whalebone did share that he hates being an inconvenience to staff; Kiri advised that when on the wing Mr Whalebone would make several calls a day to his daughter or wife. Mr Whalebone had no recall of his daughter visiting him when in hospital.

Mr Whalebone has developed friendships with others on H wing.

All meals are prepared for Mr Whalebone and brought to his cell. Mr Whalebone forgets what he has eaten and when he has eaten. He shared that sometimes he does not have cutlery, although it transpired that he has his cutlery in his cell. He would benefit from staff presenting him with the cutlery when they bring in his meal. Mr Whalebone asks staff for hot drinks although he does not like having to have sweetener. As stated above he does prefer Frosties cereal. Kiri located numerous bags of Frosties for Mr Whalebone which he was very pleased to receive and ate them immediately.

Mr Whalebone knows that he can press the call button in his cell to summons support as needed.

Mr Whalebone currently needs support to have a wash as he can be unsteady on his feet. He has an aversion to showers and has had this since a young age and has a wash at the sink. He likes to be clean shaven and again needs support with this. Mr Whalebone is aware of his personal hygiene and asked at assessment whether he was smelly which he was not.

Mr Whalebone is independent with his toilet needs and demonstrated his ability to get on and off the toilet at the time of the assessment.

Due to his reduced mobility Mr Whalebone requires support to get dressed. He also needs support to do up the velcro up on his shoes so they are secure when he is walking.

Mr Whalebone has glasses that he should wear day to day; he has one broken pair and he is concerned that he may break his spare pair and is then reluctant to wear these. Health staff are going to check there is a request in place for a sight test and new glasses for Mr Whalebone.

Mr Whalebone shared that he has not used Canteen since in IPD. He needs support to use the order n the laptop which he had from wing carers when on the wing.

Mr Whalebone shared that he sees no difference between day and night as the light is on all the time. He does not have a watch to make him aware of the time of day. He has no regular sleeping pattern.
